Fill out this form if you have taxable income in Nova Scotia and <b>any</b> of the following apply:	
<ul> <li>you have a new employer or payer, and you will receive salary, wages, commissions, pensions, employment insurance benefits remuneration</li> </ul>	, or any other
you want to change the amounts you previously claimed (for example, the number of your eligible dependants has changed)	
you want to increase the amount of tax deducted at source	
Sign and date it, and give it to your employer or payer.	
If you do not fill out Form TD1NS, your employer or payer will deduct taxes after allowing the basic personal amount <b>only</b> .	
More than one employer or payer at the same time	
If you have more than one employer or payer at the same time and you have already claimed personal tax credit amounts on an for 2023, you cannot claim them again. If your total income from all sources will be more than the personal tax credits you claim Form TD1NS, check this box, enter "0" on line 12 and do not fill in lines 2 to 11.

You may ask to have less tax deducted at source if you are eligible for deductions or non-refundable tax credits that are not listed on periodic contributions to a registered retirement savings plan (RRSP), child care or employment expenses, charitable donations, and amounts carried forward from the previous year). To make this request, fill out Form T1213, Request to Reduce Tax Deductions at S authority from your tax services office. Give the letter of authority to your employer or payer.
